EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

AN IMPACTFUL YEAR IN BRINGING CHANGES IN THE LIVES

The impactful interventions being carried out in this year, has created significant impact in the lives of people with hearing impairment. The successful running of residential school with 116 orphan and semi orphan children with hearing impairment. This residential school is not only catering to the educational needs of these children but contributing their overall growth and development. The experiences and expert teachers with innovative methodology of teaching has ensuring quality learning in a child friendly environment which has been the significant aspects in this schools. Child centric approach has been followed by the instructors which not only building strong relationship between the teacher and the student but also enhancing the learning levels of children.

Recreation and sports activities such as cultural performances, sports coaching and exposure visits have also been engaged in schooling program. Further to this, observation of significant days, such as yoga, Helen Keller birth anniversary, independence days, medical camps, cultural events, sign language awareness, marriages of persons with disabilities, sports competitions were organized.





RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL

EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN WITH HEARING IMPAIRMENT



The objective of creating educational opportunities for the children with hearing impairment has been a taken up by the People with Hearing Impaired Network – PHIN by the establishment of Residential School in central city of Hyderabad. Since the inception the school has benefited more than 200 children. This year 116 orphan and semi orphan children with hearing impairment are getting access the quality education in child friendly environment.

The trained and experienced teachers at the centre are engaging in innovative teaching methodologies to enhance the learning levels of children. Apart from this, recreational and literary activities such as cultural performance, drawing and painting competitions being organized at the school by the volunteers from corporate organization and individuals has been a respite for the children in the school.



COMPUTER TRAINING

BRIDGING DIGITAL DIVIDE AMONG CHILDREN WITH HEARING IMPAIRMENT



Computers, tablets and smartphones can be used to enhance listening for people with some degree of hearing loss. It does not aim to be comprehensive but provides a useful introduction to some of the key assistive technology available. Generally, as hearing loss gets progressively worse, difficulties in communicating increase. People with milder hearing losses may struggle when there are some background noise and people with more severe hearing loss may not be able to manage even in very quiet environments.

Wherein in the current context computer knowledge has become a pre-requisite for any employment and getting acquaint with these knowledge and training for the people with hearing impairment was a challenge. The intervention of PHIN to train the young people with hearing impairment at its premises with the support of Global Data works. A total of 15 candidates were trained in 3 batches each consists of 5 members. The courses were Ms Office with internet concepts and computer language.



EDUCATIONAL TOUR

A DIFFERENT TEACHING METHODOLOGY



The traditional methods of class-room teachers are now replaced with educational tours to make the students learn by seeing and doing thing on the field. Foregoing with this methodology of making young people with impairment to learn thing from the outside the classroom world.

PHIN has organized a educational tour for the 12 young people with hearing impairment in the month of June, 2021 at Anantagirihills a close by location from the city of Hyderabad, the origin on river Musi, as a part of providing them an opportunity to witness the wonders of mother nature, interact with rural masses and understand their challenges, opportunities and routine way of life. During the tour leadership games, trekking and cultural activities have been organized



MEDICAL CAMPS

PRIROTIZING HEALTH CHECK-UPS FOR CHILDREN



COVID-19 pandemic has brought a complex array of challenges to the health of individuals followed by its mental repercussions, including children and adolescent girls. Grief, fear, uncertainty, social isolation has negatively affected the mental health of children. Further to this it becomes need of the hour to take up routine health check-up to monitor the health status, especially for the children.

In the month of August 2021, PHIN with the support of State Bank of India, Ladies Club has conducted health camp for the children in residential school. In this camp the medical experts have carried out routine health-check-up followed by diagnosing any alignments and diseases among the children and provided them with medicines and referrals for advanced treatments. A total of 116 children, 20 staff members.



SPORTS PROMOTION

BREAKING THE BARRIERS TOWARDS A CHANGE



Persons with disabilities often face societal barriers and disability evokes negative perceptions and discrimination in many societies. As a result of the stigma associated with disability, persons with disabilities are generally excluded from education, employment and community life which deprives them of opportunities essential to their social development, health and well-being.

In some societies persons with disabilities are considered dependent and seen as incapable, thus fostering inactivity which often causes individuals with physical disabilities to experience restricted mobility beyond the cause of their disability. PHIN with the sponsorship of Bank of Baroda has initiated sports training for the 25 children of Residential schools in Table Tennis, Cricket, Chess and Carrom Board. These trainings were provided by professional coaches.





AWARENESS ON SIGN LANGUAGE

AN APPROACH TO CREATE ACCESS TO SIGN LANGUAGE



Towards promoting the sign language across various sectors and department, PHIN has taken up an initiative to train the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) officials at Rajiv Ghandi International Airport, Shamshabad on sign language for hearing impaired on a special request from the CISF Commander, Hyderabad.

In the month of July, 2021 PHIN team has trained the CISF officials on alphabets in sign language, introduction, basic phrases which are essential for the officials to understand when they come across with the people with hearing impairment. The Commander expressed his appreciation to the PHIN for taking creating awareness on sign language to the officials of various sectors and department.



SIGNIFICANT DAY CELEBRATIONS

WORLD DISABILITY DAY EVENT PARTICIPATION



The annual observance of the International Day of Disabled Persons was proclaimed in 1992, by the United Nations General Assembly resolution 47/3. The observance of the Day aims to promote an understanding of disability issues and mobilize support for the dignity, rights and well-being of persons with disabilities.

PHIN team has participated in world disability day events organized by Women Development and Child Welfare Department, Government of Telangana in the month of December, 2021. During the event PHIN team has shared their issues and concerns with Smt. Divya Devrajan, IAS Commissioner, Women Development and Child Welfare Department and Smt. Shailaja, Director, Disabled Welfare Department. During the event 120 people with hearing impairment have been mobilized to participate and express their solidarity towards persons with disabilities in the country and in the world.

Cultural performances by the children with hearing impairment were organized.

Janaki, Founder and Director, shared about the PHIN organizations efforts towards creating opportunities for the People with hearing impairment. The hon'ble guest has appreciated the organization's efforts in creating impact in the lives of the people with disabilities.
